

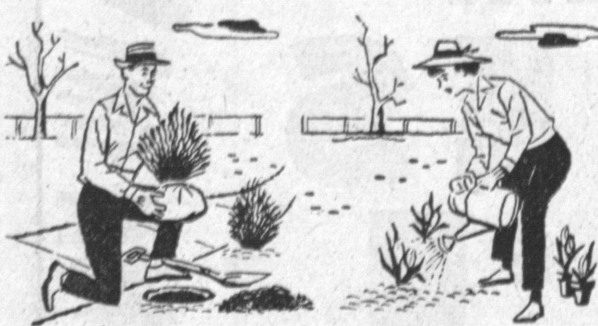

Camp Activities Offered by Torrance YMCA this Summer

Torrance YMCA announced today that nearly 500 boys and girls have registered already for one of the 11 Torrance YMCA Summer Camps.

Clifford Graybehl, YMCA Camp Committee Chairman, reported that all camps are filling rapidly.

The Summer Adventure Club is a day camp operated by the local YMCA for boys and girls six to nine years of age. These younger children will spend four weeks in August visiting spots of interest around Southern California. In addition, games, swimming, crafts, archery, sports, and two overnight camp-outs will occupy the youngsters.

New Pool

For boys nine to twelve, YMCA Camp Round Meadow is scheduled from August 8 to 15 this summer. Round Meadow will boast a new heated swimming pool. Burro hikes, Indian lore, and hearty food will fill a week of outdoor fun.

For girls nine to twelve, the YMCA offers a week of excitement at Camp Mozumdar near Crestline. The girls will go horse-back riding, swimming, hiking, ice skating, crafts, and nightly campfires.

For boys or girls 12 to 15, the YMCA offers a number of Base Camps and Caravans in the High Sierras. On each of these trips, the youngsters sleep under the stars, cook in small groups, and time is divided between sightseeing, swimming, boating, hiking, fishing, panning for gold, and relaxing around blue lakes.

Northwest Trip

One of the highlights of the summer YMCA program is a month-long Caravan to the Northwest. Designed for boys 14 and older the Torrance YMCA trip will visit Sacramento, Feather River, Mt. Lassen, Crater Lake, Mt. Hood, Mt. Rainier, Tacoma, Vancouver, B. C., Banff, Jasper, and Glacier National Parks.

The "Y" will tackle the third lovely section of the famed John Muir Trail this year from August 22 to 28. Men and boys over fourteen are invited to backpack with the YMCA along the crest of the High Sierra. Superb fish-

ing and fellowship keynote this annual hike.

Co-ed Camp

A co-ed camp will be offered to high school boys and girls at the close of the Summer by the YMCA.

On September 19 and 20, the Torrance YMCA will conclude a busy Summer with a week-end Family Camp, open to all Torrance families at Big Pine.

Graybehl pointed out that all Torrance YMCA Camps are open to any person on a first-come, first-served basis. Further information can be received by calling FAirfax 8-1272.
