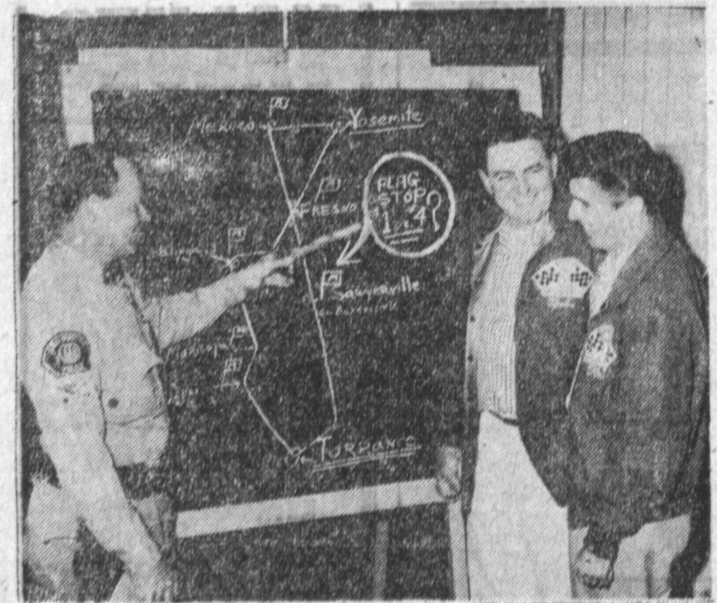

Land Ordinance Will Not Stop Plant Expansion

A new land use ordinance will not have any effect on Union Carbide's expansion plans for hydrogen manufacture. That was the opinion of Councilman George Bradford during discussion of the new law which restricts certain activities in manufacturing zones. City Attorney Stanley Remeyer said that a special permit must be obtained for certain types of manufacturing including making of explosives.

Principal Ahee Wins Doctorate

Carl R. Ahee, principal of Torrance High School, last week was awarded a doctorate in education from the University of California, after successfully completing all requirements. Dr. Ahee's dissertation dealt with "The Legal Status of the California Public School Pupil and His Parent with Respect to Attendance." He studied many of the legal aspects of education. In general, he concluded, courts hold that schools must offer education to all on an equal basis, but there is considerable confusion and conflict in it, snorted Bradford, referring to the ordinance.
