fidential" report on the situation, Isen charged that another reason for the poor state of the street was that 3000 cubic yards of waste material from another construction job had been dumped on the pavement.
The mayor charged that a contractor had been given permission to store the waste asphalt on the new road surface by a top engineering official. Later the city used its own equipment and manpower to move the material, saving the contractor \$4500.
The contractor he referred to was not Warren-Southwest. The latter firm, it was announced, had volunteered to help correct the damage south of 190th St. as a goodwill gesture.
"Arlington—the street that went nowhere—was a bungle from start to finish," declared Isen.
"I think the people of Torrance have a right to know that it was proved that all materials paid for were supplied, but that the street's condition was the result of the grossest type of mismanagement bordering on willful negligence," the mayor said.
"All the people involved are gone, and we can start fresh with a fine engineering department under the exceptional direction of Mr. Peebles," he said.
