Golf lessons for children and adults will be offered by the Torrance Recreation Dept. beginning June 22. Youngsters from 9 years through high school may learn

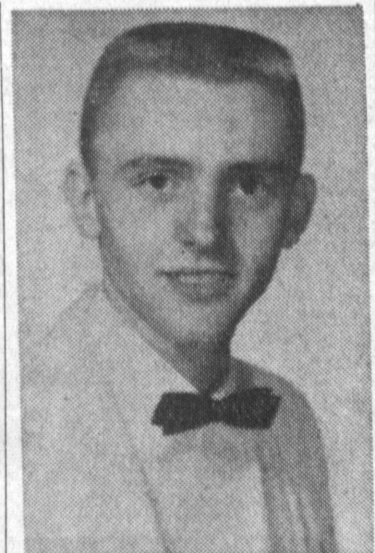
link skills Tuesdays through Saturdays in sessions at various play areas. Bob Sachse, department staff member, will give instruction to boys from 13 through 18 years at

Deputies Injured in Gun Mishap

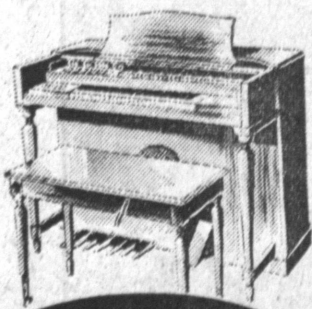
Two deputy sheriffs were treated for minor injuries Sunday after a gun exploded in the Torrance pistol range, 25851 Crenshaw Blvd.

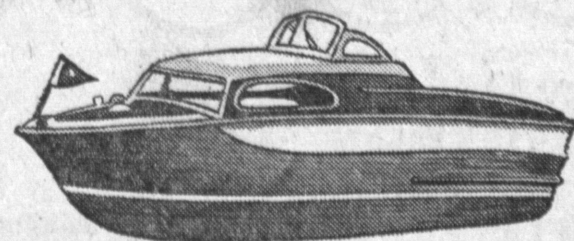
