

Torrance Evening High School Grants Diplomas to 143 Students at Rites

Some of the proudest June graduates this year are 143 graduates of Torrance Evening High School, who got their diplomas Tuesday in Torrance High Auditorium.

The graduates, who range from 17 to 54 years old, have attended night classes to get their high school diplomas. The class is divided almost equally between men and women and 80 per cent of the graduates are married. Two-thirds of them plan to take additional education.

At the same Tuesday ceremonies, 24 women who have completed vocational nurses' training will be honored.

Everett Considine, engineer for General Petroleum, will give the graduation address. School Board President Clinton Cooke will award the diplomas after presentation of the graduates by Victor Kilburn, adult school principal, and the nurses by Miss Ruth Morrison, R.N. Dr. Max Appleby, school curriculum consultant, will accept the class.

The Rev. John L. Taylor will give the invocation and benediction and the North High School Band, directed by Robert L. Jones, will play.

The list of graduates includes three husband and wife teams, including Mr. and Mrs. Gerard Olie, who were college graduates in Europe. All their educational records were destroyed during the war, however. He is an engineer. The graduating class has a total of 213 children and 28 grandchildren. They represent 33 states and four foreign countries in birth.

cared for by the South Bay Humane Society.
If you have a pet you do not want, don't abandon it to die of starvation or be killed in traffic. Take it to the South Bay Humane Society, 20336 Earl St. They will either find another home for it or mercifully put it to sleep. There are some people who do have compassion.
