New Oil Law Goes to Council

An ordinance restricting the Torrance oil drilling area and imposing additional restrictions and license fees, was introduced Tuesday.

Spokesmen for the oil industry who have made several suggestions on the subject, said that generally agree with the new law.

However, individual objections from Councilmen are expected to be voiced Tuesday when the law is up for final passage.

Three Per Cent Pay Boost in Record School Budget Figure

The record \$10,545,000 Torrance Unified School District budget will include provision for a maximum three per cent raise for teachers and classified employees.

That was announced by S. E. Waldrip, assistant superintendent, whose tentative spending program was approved by the Board of Education Tuesday.

He said that he believes that the budget will require a 10 cents boost in the override tax, bringing it to 68 of the allotted 75 cents.

The bigger budget is primarily due to an expected enrollment increase next fall of more than 2000 students. Employment of 60 additional teachers to take care of the boost will cost approximately \$750,000.

Annual Boosts
Waldrip said that yearly increments will account for an additional \$215,000.

He said he does not know how the district will be able to afford any more than a three per cent salary boost next year despite competition from other districts which will raise their minimum and maximum salaries for teachers above Torrance's schedule.

"We can't do as the city has done and not hire new employees. If we do that it will mean overcrowded classrooms," the official said.

Same Strength
He explained that while new teachers are being hired, no new groundsmen were added although the district completed six new schools, comprising 60 acres during the past years.

Waldrip also explained why his estimate of an assessed valuation increase of \$19,000,000 varies from the \$12,000,000 seen by City Manager George Stevens.

The difference, the educator said, is due to inclusion of the Victor Precinct in the school district for the first time, although the area has been in the city for several years.
