Bids Opened Tomorrow for Dominguez Drain Widening

Bids for the improvement and widening of Dominguez channel between Gramercy place and Redondo Beach Blvd., in Torrance, will be opened by flood control engineers tomorrow morning, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reported.

This project is the third in a series which will ultimately provide a concrete-lined, fully improved channel from 120th street and Crenshaw boulevard downstream to Vermont avenue just south of Artesia boulevard.

"Improvement of Dominguez channel is vitally necessary to provide good flood control and protection to the entire area," Hahn declared.

He pointed out that a number of 1952 bond issue storm drains now empty into the channel and that several of the 1958 bond issue storm drains will also carry storm waters to the channel.

Bids will be opened tomorrow on widening the channel to a width of 75 feet and a depth of about 18 feet, with the sides and bottom to be lined with reinforced concrete.

"If satisfactory bids are received it is expected that the contract will be awarded within 30 days," Hahn said.

This will mean that construction will be underway on two sections of the channel at the same time.

Portion between Denker avenue and Gramercy place is now being widened and improved, and construction crews have completed excavation work and are now pouring concrete for the bed of the channel.

First unit of the permanent channel improvements was completed 18 months ago and resulted in construction of the channel on a new alignment south of and parallel to 174th St.
