Paper Bag Company Opens With Dedication Ceremonies

The most revolutionary development in the packaging field in this century was presented to the West Thursday at the open house and dedication ceremonies at West Virginia Pulp and Paper Company's first West Coast plant in Torrance.

More than 200 company guests representing the major users of paper sacking in the 10 Western States were present as Mayor Herbert Isen of the City of Torrance and Jason M. Elsas, regional manager, Multiwall Bag Division, West Virginia Pulp and Paper headquarters in New Orleans, conducted the traditional ribbon-cutting ceremonies. The may and Elsas were assisted by Torrance City Manager George W. Stevens; Police Chief Percy G. Bennett; Fire Chief J. J. Benner; and R. S. Fitzgerald, manager of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. Messages of congratulations were received from Governor Brown and Mayor George Christopher of San Francisco, among hundreds of others.

A plant inspection tour allowed the guests to see at first hand the newest, most modern and functional plant of its kind in the country. Currently comprising some 120,000 square feet on approximately 8 acres, the anticipated expansion can include the entire 23 available acres.

More than 100 employees now operate the plant and this number will be increased to three or four hundred with an expected peak of 500 employees.

The plant currently produces 200,000 bags per day and will ultimately turn out 300,000 daily.
