These stars of the late 30's and early forty's were hitters way over the .300 mark and pitchers with 20 or near 20 victories per season. And they were handled by McCarthy, then recognized as a great leader, in the same fashion as Stengel was especially after the '58 World Series.

Joe had the real Yankees, the big ones, the ones that stayed on the top year after year. McCarthy also had that number one farm club, Newark, just a few miles away from New York were he could bring up young stars at a moment's notice. Yes, Joe had everything a manager needs to bring in a winning ball club. Yet, no one ever bothered to say that the late McCarthy was lucky, that wearing the uniform of the Yanks was his greatest claim to fame. Now in '59 many writers, besides Hirshberg, have aimed their

volleys at Stengel, accusing him of being a bum, a ham, of having an alter ego too big for his New York cap. Of course they all waited until Stengel's club landed in the cellar for the first time in 19 years back in May, before the Remingtons started to holler.


