## Double Sessions in Torrance Schools Drop Seven Per Cent as Seven New Plants Opened

The Torrance Unified School District made its biggest steps in fighting the double session bugaboo last year, following last year's approval of a \$15,000,000 bond issue by local voters, Superintendent J. H. Hull noted this week as the school year ended.

Seven new schools opened during 1958-59, bringing that district total to 31 schools, and dropping double sessions to less than seven per cent of the total enrollment. A year ago, 23 per cent were on double sessions and at the high point in 1954, 48 per cent of the local youngsters went to school half-days. These included high school students.

Opening of the seven schools—Calle Mayor, Columbia, Hamilton, Jefferson, Lincoln, Magruder, and Yukon—marked the biggest school building year in history. The district was founded in 1947, when there were three elementary schools, a high school, and about 2000 students.

**2000 Increase**  
Next fall will see more than 2000 over this year. Double sessions may increase slightly temporarily next fall. Additions at five elementary schools and two high schools now are under construction.

To meet the ever-increasing enrollment, workmen currently are busy on additions at Edison, Madrona, Walteria, Steele, and Torrance Elementary Schools and at North and South High Schools. Work also is underway on the new Adams Elementary School, 238th and Arlington, and on rehabilitation of Fern Elementary School, 1314 Fern.

**New Building**  
Construction work is slated to start this fall on Towers School, Ronald and Towers, and Madison School, 176th and Doty. Plans are being made to build Victor Elementary School, Victor and Spencer. A fourth high school—West High School—is slated to open about September, 1962, and the possibilities of a fifth high school, have been discussed. Surplus Navy land currently is being sought for this purpose, if needed.

Additions also are scheduled at Anza, Newton, Sepulveda, Flavian, Meadow Park, Adams, Riviera, Arlington, Lincoln, Carr, Crenshaw, Magruder, Perry and Jefferson Elementary Schools. If residential development continues or if large new tracts are opened for development, still more schools may be needed. Rezoning of present industrial land for residential or apartment development, currently under discussion at South Torrance, prob-

ably would mean at least one more school site, Superintendent J. H. Hull noted.

Money for all the new schools has come from bond funds voted by Torrance electors since 1947. More than \$19,500,000 was voted to build 27 complete new school plants and varying amounts of additions at four more. Another \$15,000,000 was authorized by the voters last year. Although Torrance is on the state loan program, it must pay back all money it borrows.

When it started 12 years ago, the district had only four schools and 2000 students. Today, it is 12 times larger and ranks as the fourth largest district in Los Angeles County (headed only by Los Angeles, Long Beach, and Pasadena) and the 12th largest in the state of California.

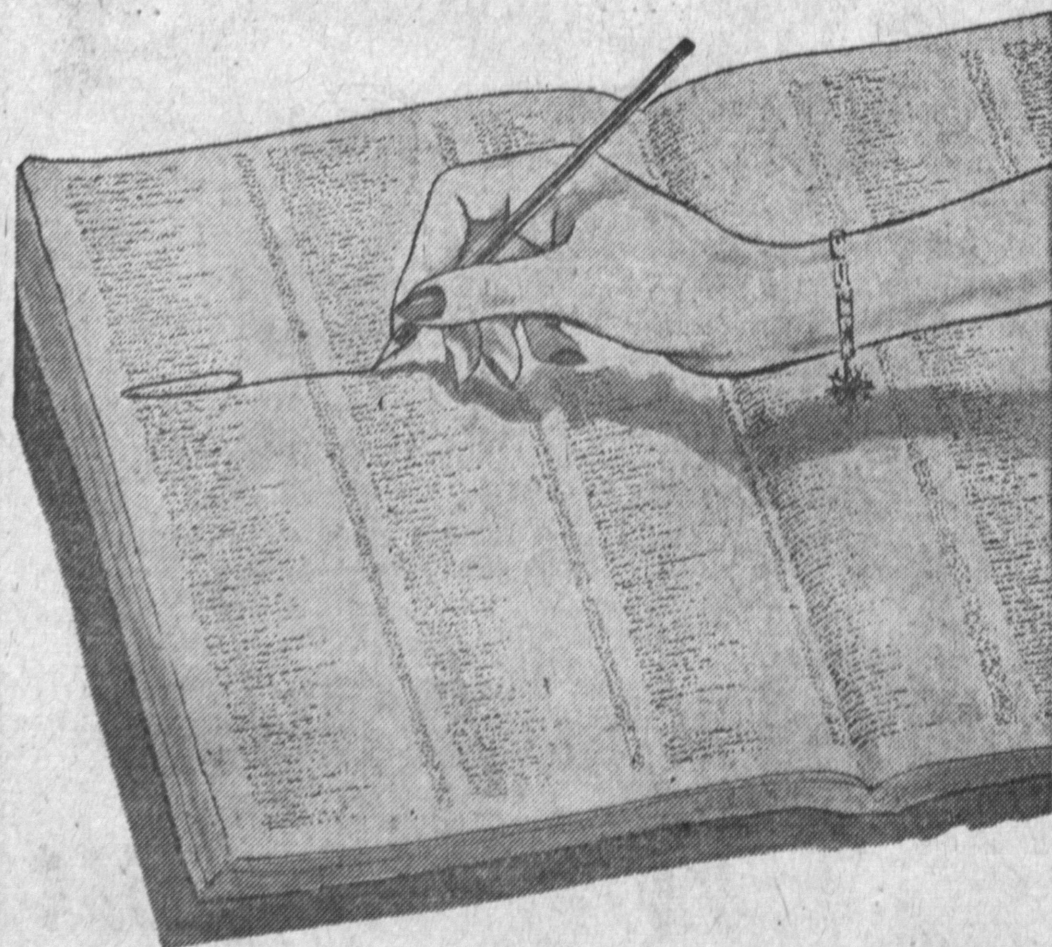
