If sickness occurs in from two to three hours after eating, blame can be laid on the toxins produced ing to the Staphylococcus family, particularly Staph. aureus. Many people unknowingly carry these organisms in the nose and throat, which are usually transferred to the hands within a short time. Food should therefore be touched as little as possible and always with thoroughly washed hands.

Staphylococci multiply with great rapidity in such items as salads and salad dressings, chicken pies, cream-filled desserts, and similar foods. Generally speaking, the greater the quantity eaten, the bigger the stomach-ache.

Should illness occur anywhere from 7 to 12 hours after eating, chances are that it is caused by a Salmonella infection from contaminated meat that was either insufficiently cooked or improperly refrigerated. This type of food poisoning is somewhat more tenacious in character and the individual may take as long as 10 days to recover. The symptoms, in both types of poisoning, include vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal cramps, and prostration.

A severe case of zinc poisoning may result from the simple and apparently harmless procedure of mixing acid foods or drinks, particularly fruit punches, in galvanized containers such as a new garbage can, a receptacle sometimes used for this purpose in group picnics. Copper cans are qually dangerous when used with cid foods

Informal picnic meals can be a ot of fun during hot weather. But, unless the food is safe to eat, the pleasure of the occasion may be spoiled by unnecessary illness. 
