Bids Received on Normandie Work

Apparent low bid for the widening and improvement of Normandie Ave. between 168th St. and Dominguez channel two blocks south of Artesia Blvd. has been submitted by Warren Southwest, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn reported this week.

Seven bids were received on the project, ranging from the apparent low of \$48,495 to a high of \$56,362.

All bids are now being checked for accuracy and analyzed and it is expected that award of contract for the work will be recommended to the Board of Supervisors within two weeks.

Hahn said that the plans call for widening the roadway from its present two lanes to four lanes. Work will include construction of paved shoulder, curbs, gutters and necessary drainage structures.
