

Harbor Area Chest Team in Top Position on Recruiting

The Harbor Area Community Chest team of volunteers soared into a position at the end of this week sought by the Los Angeles Dodgers. This could only be first place.

With this honor, the Harbor Area Chest team was awarded the Harry Morrill trophy for being the best organized area to date.

Area Chairman Jim Becker, Torrance-Lomita, Southern California Gas Co., reported the top percentage—100 per cent of required organization, thereby beat out the four other areas making up the Associated Cities department of the Red Feather appeal.

Reports were given at a meeting, held at Orthopaedic Hospital, and attended by Becker and Frode B. Kilstofe, Wilmington, area advance gifts chairman.

"We're just warming up, too," Becker said. "By the time we take the field in October, we'll have more than 4900 volunteer workers needed for our seven Harbor area 'communities.'"

"With the leaders we've enrolled to date and their willingness to give time to this community effort for 165 causes, I am confident we will stay in first place throughout the campaign."

In second place behind Harbor is Centinela Valley, followed by the San Fernando Valley, West and Southeast.

Support at Rose Parade

Over 4,000 letters were mailed last week to Torrance business and professional leaders by the Torrance Chamber of Commerce urging support of the city's entry in the 1960 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena on New Year's Day, according to an announcement by George A. Bradford, chairman of the Torrance Tournament of Roses Association.

Bradford said he was certain the necessary amount would be raised—estimated at slightly over \$3,000. Receipts from July's Ranchero Days Celebration added over \$2,000 to the fund, the Torrance City Council said.

Recognition Given Calvary Baptist Church School

Calvary Baptist Elementary School received special recognition in the two mornings services today at the Calvary Baptist Church. Rev. H. Earl Kuester, spoke on the evangelistic outreach of the Church through the school. M. Thomas Kelly, principal, reported on its statistical and historical growth.

Many families now in the church have been reached as a result of their first contact with the school, Rev. Kuester pointed out in his message. The school is closely connected to the church in harmony and policy of doctrine and functions with its own staff and school board. Pupils of all denominations are represented here.

Calvary Baptist School is fourth largest of the Baptist Elementary Schools in the Southern California area, pays the highest salaries to its teachers, each of who has a minimum of a Baptist Teaching Credential. Tom Kelly stated in his talk to the congregation.

He further added that the texts, workbooks and materials are on a par with those of the public schools with teaching emphasis being placed on the 3 R's. The curriculum is being strengthened this year with the addition of a course in Spanish for the 4th, 5th, and 6th grades, and additional stress upon Art and Music.

The school has an annual budget of over \$25,000.00, an Audio-Visual Library of films, filmstrips, projectors, records and record players worth several hundred dollars. Books, workbooks and supplies are furnished the children.

Following the services a display of instructional materials and aids was presented, showing the wide variety of educational services available to the children at the school.


