In Sandy Koufax, Becker had a mammoth job cut out for him. If you recall Sandy had much trouble finding the plate with his fast ball and curve. Even though the young lefthander pitched beautifully in spots during the year, Becker must still work with him when spring training rolls around in March.

With Drysdale, after Don had won a few, Joe had to contend with a righthander who had become starstruck. Not accredited with the credentials of a psycholegist, Becker, nevertheless, helped Don to establish the 17-13 record he compiled this year. A noble feat were Drysdale the only pitcher on the squad.

In the first month of play Johnny Podres looked great. His rainbow curve, fast ball and change-up were the best pitches in the league. Then Johnny started to falter. His control was way off and the batters were finding his pitches perfect for home run hits. Podres was angry and confused. Yet Becker stayed with him and got John to regain the confidence in himself that he had lost. Although Podres cannot be rightly called a great pitcher, he, however, helped the Dodgers in key games.

McDevitt Good Example

In little Danny McDevitt, Coach Joe had his most rewarding moments. In 1957 Danny was considered wilder than an Elvis Presley song and dance routine. It seemed that Danny was destined to become the most noted free-pass giver in the business. Yet when he reported to Becker, Danny found the master giving him the advice he needed to curb his generous desires. Mac pitched beautifully in spots.


