**Follow-up Polio Clinic Slated by Juniors**

There will be a follow-up Polio Clinic held Nov. 3, from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Victor Benstead Plunge, 3331 Torrance Blvd. Inoculations will be \$1 per person.  
It is important for those who have begun their series of inoculations to continue at the intervals recommended by the National Polio Foundation.  
According to the representatives of the Foundation, the 2nd inoculation should follow the first in 4 to 6 weeks, the 3rd should be 7 to 9 months later and the 4th should be one year later. The fourth inoculation is now considered important for complete immunization.
