Enjoy California Walnut Chocolate Meringue Strips, the perfect cookie for your next coffee session whether midday or evening. These cookies are rich gems of sweet, fresh-tasting walnuts and convenient morsels of semi-sweet chocolate mixed into a light brown sugar meringue set atop a rolled oats base.

Walnuts for cracking come in sparkling one and two-pound eellophane bags. Or try the handy shelled California walnuts in either the recipe-size saran bags or vacuum cans. Just empty the semi-sweet chocolate morsels from the bag right into the meringue. What could be easier.

California Walnut Chocolate Meringue Strips

½ cup butter
1 cup light brown sugar,
firmly packed teaspoon vanilla egg, separated

1/2 cup sifted all-purpose flour

3/4 cup quick cooking rolled 1 6-ounce package semi-sweet

chocolate morsels (1 cup) % cup California walnuts, coarsely chopped (3-ounce

Cream butter. Gradually add ½ cup of brown sugar; cream until light. Mix in vanilla, egg yolk, flour and rolled oats. Spread in a buttered 8-inch square baking pan. Beat egg white until stiff; gradually beat in remaining ½ cup brown sugar until stiff peaks form. Mix in semi-sweet chocolate morsels and half of walnuts. Spread over oatmeal mixture and sprinkle with remaining walnuts. Bake at 350 degrees 35 to 40 minutes or until meringue is golden brown. Let cool in pan. Cut in strips. Makes about 2 dozen strips.



Sliced Brazil nuts, rice and diced cooked poultry or ham present a main dish which borrows from Near East cookery. This pilaf is a novel way to use a small portion of left-over turkey, chicken or ham and still have a company-beautiful course. Brazil nuts with their delicate richness of flavor also contribute texture interest to this main dish. If you like browned-in-butter rice, you'll be delighted then by this combination of rice, Brazil nuts

Thin Brazil nut petals may be used as a garnish by cutting the big jumbo nuts lengthwise with a vegetable peeler. Brazil Nut Pilaf

3 tablespoons butter or margarine
1/2 cup coarsely chopped

1 cup diced celery teaspoon salt

cup uncooked white rice Brazil nuts 1 can (3 or 4 ounces) 2 cups diced cooked chicken, turkey or ham (optional)

Melt butter in heavy saucepan or skillet. Add Brazil nuts and cook slowly, stirring occasionally, until the nuts are toasted a delicate brown. Drain mushrooms; measure liquid; add water to make $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups. Add liquid and mushrooms to skillet along with celery, bouillon cubes and salt; bring to a boil. Add rice slowly. Cover; reduce heat and simmer 25 minutes. When used as a main dish, add chicken last 10 minutes of cooking time.
