Mayor Seeks to Halt **Apartment Services**

Mayor Albert Isen, fed up with ever increasing squawks from industry and apartment - house owners over trash collection, has called a special session of City Council for tomorrow at 5:30 p.m.

At that time he will ask the council to eliminate all but residential rubbish pick-

The most anguished cries have emerged from commercial establishments and apartment - house operators, who are charged for rubbish and garbage removal that never is provided.

The thorn in the complainants' side is that industry is paying for a service the city couldn't possibly provide. Apartments must hire private collectors, because the city pickups aren't frequent enough. Worse, the city insists combustible, noncombustible, and garbage be senarated.

Mayor Isen is of the persuasior that the rubbish program is a service rather than a municipal obligation.
