Molasses Treats



Even ghosts like to eat on Halloween. So for party masque Riven gnosts like to eat on Halloween. So for party masque-raders, have lots of good, crisp and inexpensive molasses cookies on hand. A favorite gingerbread boy dough can be made in the shape of pumpkins, witches and cats. The only trick is cutting the dough in rounds and using a bit of frosting to bring out the face features. Along with the rolled cookies, make a pan of molasses fruit squares and spread them with orange-tinted frost-ing. Served together, the crisp and bar-type sweets, will make fine go-alongs for a hot drink.

1/4 cup shortening 1/4 cup sugar 1/4 teaspoon baking 1 teaspoon salt cup sugar teaspoon baking soda teaspoon salt

% cup unsulphured molasses
1 egg
1% cups sifted flour
1 cup finely-cut dates
% cup chopped walnut

Cream together the shortening, sugar, soda, salt and cinnamon. Beat in molasses, then egg. Stir in flour, dates and nuts. Spread in a greased and lightly-floured 9 x 9 x 2-inch baking pan. Bake in moderate oven (375°F.) 25 minutes. Cool. Turn out on cutting board or plate. Make confectioners' sugar frosting adding 1 tablespoon grated orange rind and tint orange with a few drops of food coloring. Frost. To cut into squares, make 5 cuts one way
