Funeral Rites Conducted for Dr J. L Bloch

Funeral services for Dr. Jesse L. Bloch were conducted yesterday at the Cleveland Mortuary, San Pedro.

Dr. Bloch, who died Sunday, was active in the business and community life of San Dada since 1924 when he began his medical practice in this city. A native of Athena, Ore., Dr. Bloch received his medical degree from the University of Oregon in 1919. He was a founder and director as well as past chief of staff of the San Pedro Community Hospital. He was chairman of the board of managers of the YWCA.

Among Dr. Bloch's business af-filiations was his prominent part in the founding of First Federal Savings and Loan Association in San Pedro which merged with Glendale Federal Savings and Loan Association in June of this year. He was director and president of First Federal Savings and an officer and member of the advisory committee of the merged First Federal Savings-Glendale Federal Savings and Los Association.
