Dope, Addicts, Pushers What Is the Real Cause?

And there was no dope problem before the law. Yet politicians and heads of police agencies - more concerned that a sheep-like public one day may become imperfectly terrified of their holy position - continue 🕷 to force their wearisome lucubrations into print.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, who certainly has sense enough to know better, has joined the neurotic frenzy that calls for more blood, tougher laws, and maniacally screams for things like life sentences for dope peddlers. screams for things like life sentences for dope peddlers.

More horrible sentences will not put the dope peddler out of business; the only thing that will go up is the price of narcotics.


In the '20s, for example, a dope user was as rare as a snuff sniffer is today. The cokie or morphine fancier of that era had one reason for his addiction: to be able to concentrate on what he was doing at the moment, calmly and confidently to do his work.

There were no withdrawal pains, for there was no withdrawal. He knew his life would be shortened, but not so much as it would be by cigarettes. And there were no pushers. Today the cigarette pusher is on billboards, TV, and in most magazines.

In the past, there was no outrageous conduct, no offense by dope users. The personality that will appal a fellow man will do so without dope. This is part of the interior of the problem, but it is easier to expound at the surface.

Rather than to demand more laws and more brutal penalties, it would make more sense to seek answers from the psychiatrist and other persons with a genuine interest in the welfare of the people than to continue to act on results of exploring superficial appearances. Or do we fear their answers?

The appearance is that dope is the menace. Where it is legal, no menace exists. We have the toughest laws and the worst problems. Scratch the surface, then, and it may be discovered that dope no more makes an addict than paint makes a painting.
