College Students Go to Germany

Stanford University's fourth and largest group of students for its study center in Germany leaves Tuesday, December 29, from the San Francisco International Airport.

Sixty-eight students, 36 women and 32 men, will spend the next six months at Stanford's branch campus 12 miles from Stuttgart, just outside the village of Buetselbach on a 30-acre estate called Landgut Burg.

They replace 63 students who have studied at the self-governed auxiliary campus since last June. Classes begin Jan. 4, and with the exception of a spring vacation will continue through June 9.

Daniel Pierce of Balboa was elected student body president for the winter-spring term. Business manager is Nancy Joan Maurer of Pomona, and activities chairman is Gregg Hopkins of Brea. Judy Lowder of Compton was elected secretary, and public relations chairman is Jacqueline Dewell of Berkeley.

The German campus offers Stanford undergraduate students, except freshmen, the opportunity to live, travel and study abroad

for six months without interrupting the normal four-year progress toward a degree. Courses which are enriched by a European setting—such as European culture and politics, and intensive German—are selected from the regular Stanford curriculum. Tuition and room and board costs are the same as on the home campus. Cost of the flight over is included in the plan. Passage home is arranged by the student himself.
