These are highlights of the new 1959 issue of "The World's Telephones" just released by American Telephone and Telegraph

The report takes nearly a year to compile. It shows that the U.S. with more than 66 million telephones at the start of '59 (71 million now) accounted for more than 50 percent of the world's

The United Kingdom, with 71/2 million sets, ran second in total telephones. Canada was third with more than 5 million, followed closely by West Germany. Russia has an estimated 3,700,000

Alaska and Hawaii, according to the report, are the two "talkingest" places in the world. Alaska averaged 609 telephone conversations per person in 1958 and Hawaii 536. Next came Canada with 511, the U.S. with 472 and Sweden with 346.




