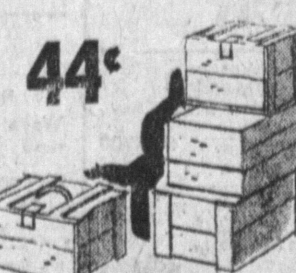

Lynn, Massachusetts and Pueblo, Colorado were estimated to have a population of 99,000 on Jan. 1, 1959. The local Chamber issued a friendly challenge to both of them that the All-America City would have a larger population when the final U.S. Census is announced in mid-1960.

The Lynn Chamber hasn't even replied to the three months old challenge, and Pueblo has decreed that the contest isn't "ethical."
