Q-A relative suffered a coronary attack and is now on strict diet, mainly salt-free and cholesterol-free. He was told he could not use butter, which contains animal fat high in cholesterol, but he could use margarine or the different vegetable fats that do not contain cholesterol. Is this true?

Answer-Margarine, being hydrogenated vegetable fact, does not contain cholesterol, but the body can convert vegetable fats into cholesterol. When there is a low intake of dietary cholesterol, there is a higher bodily conversion of vegetable fat to cholesterol, and vice-versa.
