



**Oakes, Motter  
Enter USAC  
Midget Races**

Dany Oakes, Earl Motter and Bill Cantrell, the first three finishers in last year's Pacific Coast standings, were the first entries in for 1960's first USAC midget auto race, a 100-lap National Championship event, Sunday afternoon, Feb. 7, on the new Ascot Stadium's half-mile dirt oval.

J. C. Agajanian has posted a purse of \$3,000 against 40 percent of the gate for this event card which kicks off the local season for the Indianapolis drivers and their powerful Offenhauser midgets.

Only 1 and 14 point separated Oakes and Motter last year as Danny won first Pacific Coast championship under the United States Auto Club banner. He had won several under old AAA. Cantrell was less than 25 points back.

Motter opened the 1959 local season for USAC with a rain-shortened victory over the late George Amick in the 100-lap feature at the 183rd and Vermont Avenue 880. On his next outing at Ascot, Earl hit the wall as he did last May at Indianapolis. Motter's victory at Ascot came on his 40th birthday.

Other entries set include Dave Moses, the only double winner on last year's USAC Pacific Coast circuit; Johnny Moorhouse, Jimmy Davies, Cal Niday and "Bullet" Joe Garson.

Agajanian expects to receive a host of entries from mid-west and eastern drivers, including Tony Bettenhausen, the two-time National Driving Champion, and winner of last year's Thanksgiving night Grand Prix at Gardena.

Besides the 100-lap main event for the fastest 18 cars, there will be a 15-lap semi-main, four 6-lap heat races, a 3-lap trophy dash for the four fastest qualifiers, and qualifying.

**Millionth Ton of Oxygen**

The millionth ton of liquid oxygen-nitrogen for the USAF Air Research and Development Command has been produced by five major liquid generating facilities. This marks the 10th anniversary of the ARDC, being observed this month.

The five facilities, which make 85% of the Air Force's consumption, were designed, built and are operated by Air Products, Inc.

Early in 1955 when the Air Force announced its requirement for large quantities of liquid oxygen and nitrogen, Air Products, of Allentown, Pa., was chosen from competing bidders to design, build and operate the Air Force's major production facilities.

Since the first plant, built in the Santa Susana mountains of Southern California, went on stream in mid-1956, Air Products

operators have produced 1,000,000 tons for the Air Force at five locations including Cape Canaveral. Liquid oxygen is the mainstay oxidizer for the Atlas, Redstone, Titan, Thor, and Jupiter missiles. Nitrogen is pressurizing agent.

The million tons would occupy 25,000 railroad tank cars that would make a train 237 miles long.
