Hahn Asks Probe of Flooding in North Torrance

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has requested M. E. Salsbury, chief engineer, County Flood Control District, to conduct a full investigation of the flooding of a portion of North Torrance when Dominguez channel overflowed during last Monday's storm and to take steps to prevent the flooding from recurring.

"A major program to widen and deepen the channel and to line it with concrete has been under construction three years, and to date nearly \$4,000,000 has been spent to prevent the flooding of Torrance and other communities along the route Hahn declared.

He said that four years ago a storm flooded parts of North Torrance and Lawndale and that he made an inspection with Col. H. E. Hedger, then chief engineer. At that time, Hedger agreed to the channel from Vermont Ave. to Crenshaw Blvd. at 120th St.

As a result, two major sections between Vermont and Denker Ave. and between Denker and Gramercy Place have been widened and improved, and crews are working on the segment between Gramercy and Redondo Beach Blvd.
