## **Refiners Check Bromine Content**

Petroleum refiners in Los Angeles County are adjusting their supplies of gasoline to comply with air pollution control laws, effective July 1.

This conclusion was reached by the Air Pollution Control District, which today released its monthly report of the Bromine number ratings of gasolines marketed in the Los Angeles Basin during January.

After July 1, all gasolines sold in the Los Angeles Basin must be below the Bromine 30 level.
