## "METROPOLITAN NEWSPAPERS NO LONGER HAVE EDGE"

Says Famous News Commentator

These are excerpts . . . direct quotes . . . from a National Newspaper Week address by William Keneally, radio KFWB news commentator

... AND HERE IS WHAT MR. KENEALLY SAID:

"THIS IS AN ERA CHARACTERIZED BY MERGER AND THE DISAPPEARANCE OF METROPOLITAN DAILIES.

"The community newspaper is becoming increasingly important as a guardian of your way of life.

"The day may not be too far off when instead of four metropolitan newspapers there will be only two in Los Angeles.

"This may not be so great a loss as some would fear, for the metropolitans have already tried to spread themselves too thin. And the community papers have thereby found their place in the sun because of this condition.

"The metropolitan dailies have ended up speaking only for the big centrally located interests. Politically as a force they are on the wane.

"This has been evidenced many times in recent years when they have more than crossed swords with the community press and come out on the short end.

"TODAY, YOUR COMMUNITY NEWSPAPER IS YOUR VOICE IN THE BIG POLITICAL EVENTS OF THE DAY.

"Your elected representatives in county government—the board of supervisors—are no longer elected by the metropolitan newspapers. Rather, they look to the community press close to their constituents as the more likely medium to be voicing the people's sentiments.

"THE COMMUNITY NEWSPAPER HAS ARRIVED!

"No longer do the metropolitan newspapers have the edge.

"No longer do the metropolitan newspapers have direct contact with the people of the various communities.

"No longer is the board of supervisors under the wing of the metropolitan newspapers. At least three of the present board clearly owe their election to the community press.

"Community events such as city council meetings, school board meetings, service club news, births, deaths, weddings, and PTA are given prominence in the community newspapers.

"IN MOST OF THE OUTLYING COMMUNITIES YOU COULD WAIT A LIFETIME TO READ THE NEWS YOU WANT IN A METROPOLITAN PAPER.

"YOU WANT TO SEE YOUR COMMUNITY GROW SO YOU ADVERTISE IN THE COMMUNITY NEWSPAPER. YOU ASK YOUR CUSTOMERS AND BUSINESS FRIENDS TO TRADE AT HOME IN YOUR OWN CITY AND TOWN.

"The community newspaper's advertising man and editor are your friends and acquaintances. They are not some nebulous person in the big city. Your community publisher or editor can be reached personally or by telephone any time. This is not the case with metropolitan newspapers."
