### **Planners Delay Decision on** Ski Run Here

The Ski Chalet, impressive \$500,000 development planned for the Palos Verdes east of Richville St., has been put off the Planning Commission calendar till Wednesday for study.

Developer of the project, John Mascola, was turned down on a zone change last November. Now he is seeking a use variance to develop the property.

An overflow crowd heard arguments before the commission last week. Many residents opposed the plan on grounds it might be a nuisance and decrease property values.

Others, including high - school students, spoke in favor of the chalet as a benefit to the city and an added recreation facility. The ski run would be 332 feet long and packed with a foot of snow. The development would include a coffee shop, service space, offices, and a lounge.

A Planning Commission committee is discussing the issue with proponents and opponents this week.
