New quarters will be at 23252 Robert Rd.

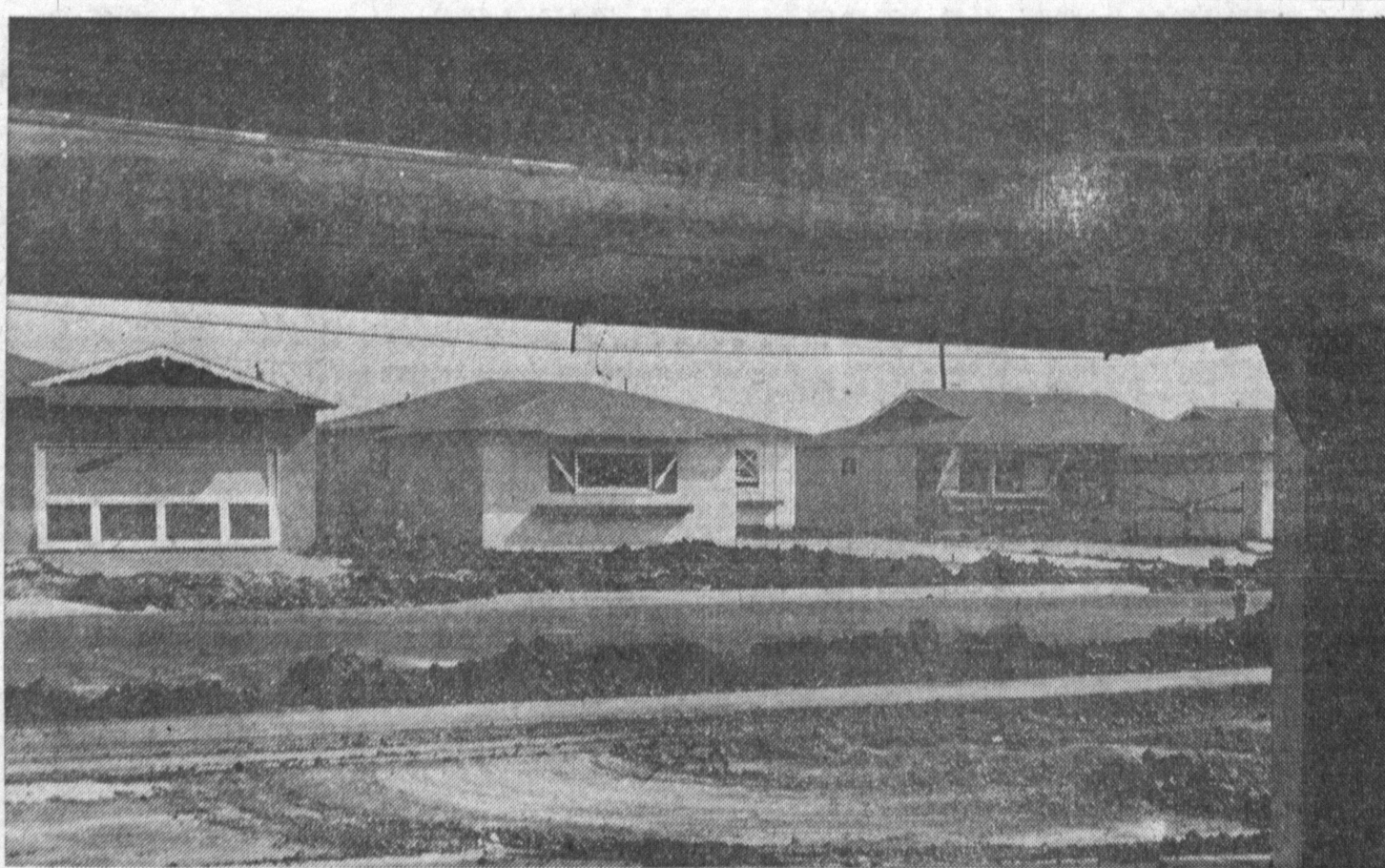

School Facilities Used 1538 Times by Outside Units

Community organizations used Torrance school facilities 1538 times during the last quarter of 1959, according to a report of the Board of Education.

Leading user was the Recreation Department, which took out 588 permits for the period.

Scout groups took 406 permits, while college extension courses accounted for 274 permits. PTA groups used facilities 189 times, while YMCA and YWCA groups had 93 permits and Little Leaguers 24.

Other groups included barber-shop quartets, charity groups, a children's nursery, and the City of Torrance.

Californians in New World Travel Record

Travel by Californians hit a new record during 1959, with a 26% increase in passports, to maintain the state's position as second largest contributor to the world travel stream, the Automobile Club of Southern California reported.

Passports to California residents totaled 110,869.
