## Loyalty-Oath Restriction Will Be Tested in Civil Liberties Law Suit

The American Civil Liberties Union has appealed to the state Supreme Court for a ruling on constitutionality of a loyalty oath required for use of public-school auditoriums.

A petition attacked refusal of the Los Angeles and San Diego boards of education to abide by a superior-court ruling last June which held the loyalty requirement unconstitutional.

Despite Judge Philbrick McCoy's decision that the loyalty provision violates freedom of speech, the Los Angeles and San Diego school boards continue to require a statement disclaiming advocacy of violent overthrow of the government, the suit charged.

Applications for use of auditoriums for a series of meetings in Los Angeles and San Diego were denied after ACLU officials declined to execute the loyalty disclaimer.

A. L. Wirin, Abraham Gorenfeld, and Irwin Gostin, attorneys, charged the oath requirement denies freedom of speech without the safeguards of due process by placing the burden of proof of innocence upon the applicant.

In 1946 the ACLU challenged a similar oath provision required

by the San Diego school district. In that case the State Supreme Court voided the loyalty test on grounds that "the state has more to gain than to lose by a generous tolerance of the convictions and affiliations of its citizens so long as they present no clear and present danger to the community."
