The crappie were good sized with some taken over two pounds.

Around the fresh water scene: Lake Mead—Bass fishing good with best bait mudsuckers and deep running lures. Colorado River—Water high and muddy, fishing slow, catfishing good near Blyth with worms best bait. Weather cold but good catfishing at night. Henshaw—Good bass fishing as well as fair Crappie and Bluegill. This is one of the few lakes producing bass on shallow and surface running plugs. Cachuma—Good bass fishing. Fish running smaller than last year with several stringers showing limits of 1 to 1½ pounds. Piru—Trout fishing is good with weekly planting of good sized trout. The lake is rising due to recent rain. Cold water has slowed the bass fishing but some are being taken on yellow bombers and hellbenders.

Salt water fishing is still unsettled with weather the main factor. A few warm calm days would bring the game fish back in. The bait is here but the water temperature and rough current has chased the fish into deep

Boys are urged to register on one of these dates for sure, as only those who have completed registration will be eligible for Try-outs on March 13.

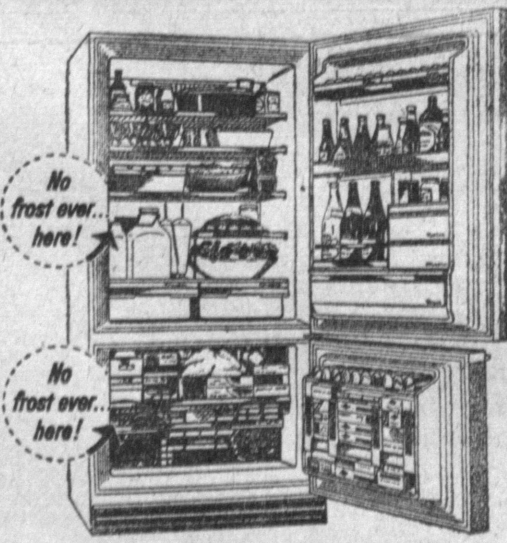

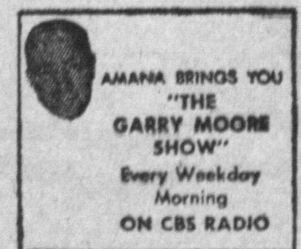
