Four Torrance High Students to Produce Original Plays

This year, as in eight previous years, Miss De Camp will sponsor the "Original One-Act Play Festival" and will present a trophy to each of the winning authors.

Three of these plays will be presented Friday, March 11, at 8 p.m. in the Torrance High School Auditorium. The fourth will be presented at a special program for the student body.

The students will cast and direct their own plays. A critique will be held in the cafeteria following the Friday-night performance, at which time the plays will be discussed and evaluated by a panel of critics, headed by Miss De Camp.

Tickets for the festival may be bought from any member of the cast or at the door.

Torrance Composer's Work will be Featured at Cancioneros Concert

A choral work by a musician and resident of Torrance will be a highlight of Los Cancioneros' 10th anniversary concert Saturday, March 26, at Pier Avenue School auditorium, Hermosa Beach.

The chorus, which originated in Hollywood Riviera in 1949, will perform Lyle Heck's setting of the liturgical "Te Deum Laudamus" as the final number in a group of sacred choral works ranging from 16th-century church music to that of the present day.

Heck is well known throughout Southern California as a singer, choral conductor, and teacher.

Barbara Mabin of Rolling Hills, is her seventh year as musical director of the chorus, will conduct. She has selected numbers to appeal to every musical taste. From secular choral music she has chosen the gypsy songs of Johannes Brahms, a group of folk songs in new arrangements, and a short concert version of George Gershwin's "Porgy and Bess," featuring members of the chorus as soloists and instrumentalists.
