City's Pilot Club Welcomes Two

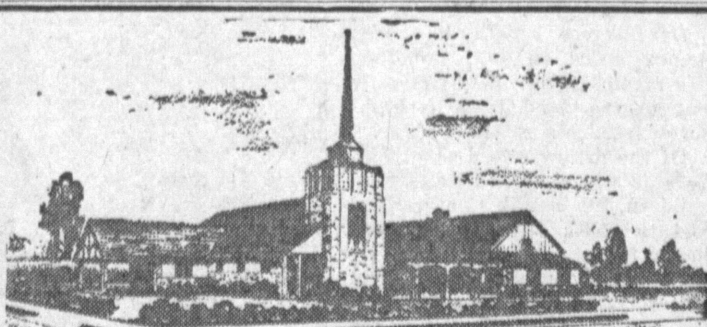
The Pilot Club of Torrance welcomed two new members at a recent meeting in the Port Washington Room at the Fish Shanty.

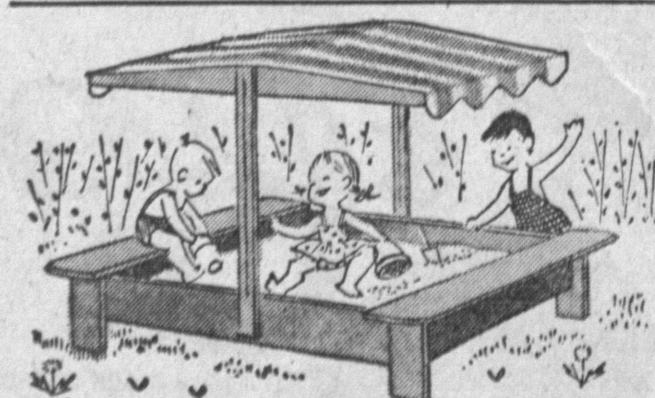

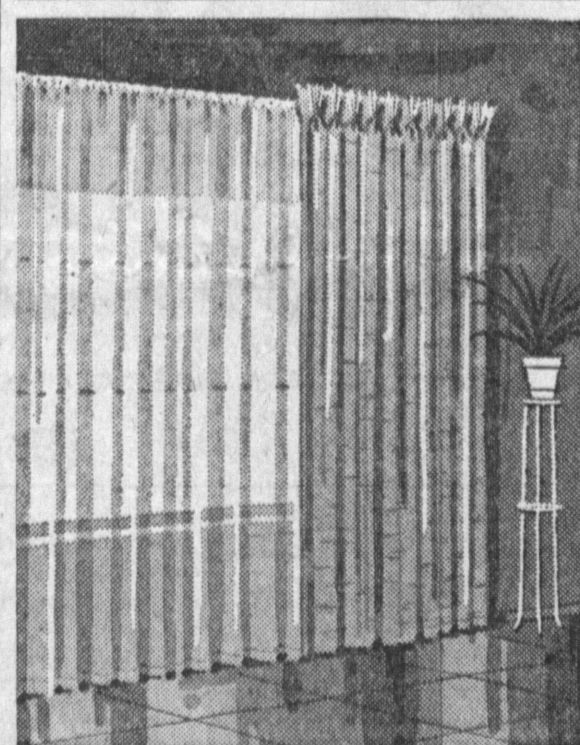
