## 259th Pl. PTA Lists Year's Achievements

The PTA at 259th Place School is under the leadership of Mrs. W. N. Kopley Jr. Members work toward aiding children and promoting a better understanding between parents and teachers.

The group has given \$25 to emergency welfare; \$98 to the health center; \$60 for the 10th district milk and lunch program; \$55 for two tonsillectomies; \$50 for the Christmas gift to the

school; and \$70 to its adopted school.

Besides individual expenditures, money has been used for milk and lunches at the school, a Christmas film for the children, room prizes, and A-6 luncheons.

Of indirect benefit has been money spent on four honorary life memberships. This money is put into a fund to help high-school students attend college.

Of the money raised each year, 75% is given to the welfare of children, the Health Center Fund and the 10th District milk and lunch fund.

Ways-and-means chairmen, Meses. T. D. Trujillo and R. W. Gerhart, have announced that the largest project this year was the "Clown Fun Festival."

New to the program has been a continuous popcorn sale.

There also was a rummage sale; and a paper drive is planned. A total of \$1,335.37 has been collected.

In November, members heard a teacher's panel discuss curriculum, home work, and work habits of the elementary school child.

In February, a panel of four foreign students from Harbor College was featured.

At the school open-house meeting parents visited classrooms and attended the Christmas program in the auditorium. There were songs by the student chorus and the Mothersingers.
