Dreamer Consumed by His Dream to Be Topic at Temple Menorah

"The Dreamer Consumed by His Dream" will be the title of the sermon by Rabbi Henri Front tomorrow night at 8:30 at Temple Menorah of the South Bay, 112 North Catalina, Redondo Beach.

The address, the third in a series on the Zionist movement, will be an analysis of the life and works of Theodore Herzl, the founder of the modern Zionist movement. The series was instituted in honor of the 100th anniversary of the birth of Herzl.

The first sermon gave a history of the land of Palestine through the numerous invasions which "turned the land once flowing with milk and honey into a land of sand and desolation," said the Rabbi.

The second lecture gave an introduction to the pre-Herzlian leaders of the burgeoning movement to found a spiritual homeland for the Jews.

"Because of the failure of modern Europe to live in harmony with the ideals of their religion, anti-Semitism in the form of pogroms in East Europe and such events in Western Europe as the Dreyfus Case, came to be."

"A return to the land pledged to the Jewish people by God in the early books of the Bible was the only solution. Unfortunately, the leaders of the nations prevented a logical and simple solution to the problems of resettlement, and as a result six million Jews were exterminated by the Nazis."

"Only then did a so-called humane society permit the creation of a state in Israel," the Rabbi said.

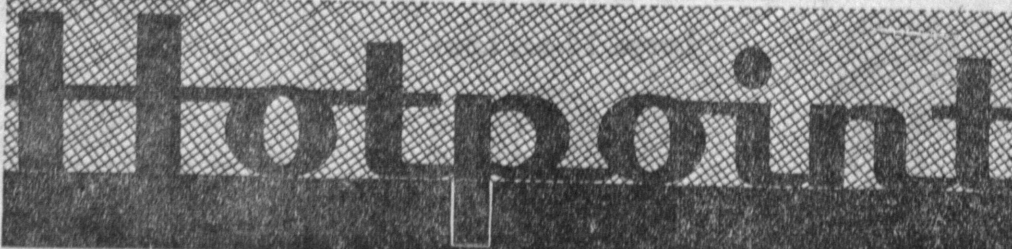

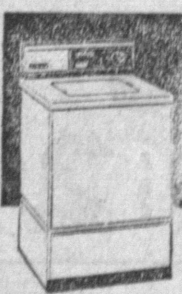

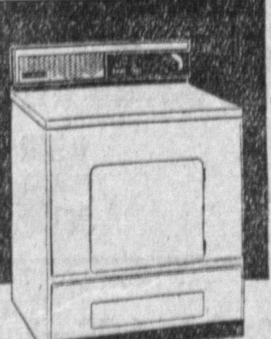
