Louis Rene Beaudoin, former speaker of the House of Commons of Canada, will address the faculty of El Camino College on the future of Canada at 11 a.m., April 7.

Elected to the House of Commons in 1945, Beaudoin served as deputy chairman of the committees of the whole house from 1949 to 1951, deputy speaker from 1951 to 1953, and speaker from 1953 to 1957.

His activities in Commonwealth politics include his presidency of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, chairmanship of the executive committee of the Canadian Branch of the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association, and delegate of that association to conferences in New Zealand, Australia, Ceylon, and London.
