## Security-First National Bank Branches Being Built Here

The branch will also have a walk-up customer service counter in the rear.

panels and protective canopies will highlight the exterior of the 190th and Anza branch. Of bold contemporary design by Killingsworth, Brady & Smith, the bank will also feature recessed lighting, air conditioning, acoustical tile ceilings, and an employees' lounge.

Both branches will offer customers complete banking accommodations, including safe deposit, escrow, savings and loans. Ample customer parking will also be available. Ray V. Anderson of Venice is the builder for downtown Torrance, and Jackson Brothers of Los Angeles has been contracted for the Anza job.

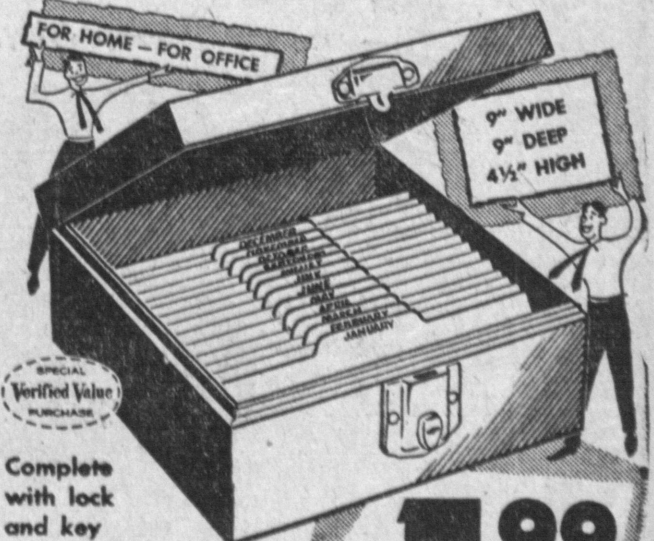
