Hogue, Bolton and Kehoe tied the mound for the winners giving up 10 hits with two errors committed behind them. Marsten caught behind the plate.

Hubert, second baseman led South High with the stick getting a double and single and driving in two runs. His season's average is .245. Dun Eason, right fielder, spanked a double as a pinch hitter. His average is .750.

Defensively the double play of Hubert to Golthenee, shortstop to Merrill at first base stood for the victors.

Today will see Coach Robert Shoup's nine traveling to Leuzinger fair, starting at 3 p.m. North High and Santa Monica have a 3-2 record. Mira Costa leads the circuit with 4-1.

South High Trounces Culver City

South High Whipped Culver City 10 to 5 in the Bay League Tuesday afternoon.

Twirling for the winners were Larry Pace, and John Mewborn who gave up 7 hits and struck out 3 batters.

Leading the attack for Coach Jerry McIlvaine's aggregation was Richard Gomez, second baseman, who got 3 for 3 including a triple, to drive in 3 runs. Doug Perry, leftfielder spanked a 3-run homer in the first frame. First baseman Joe Austin got 2 for 2 and one RBI. He is hitting .439.

South High missed a triple play by an eyelash. With Culver City runners on first in the fourth with no outs, third baseman Larry Anderson trapped a hot grounder, stepped on third, whipped the ball to Gomez who shot to first baseman Merrill, a second too late.

South High will be home today to face Beverly Hills starting at 3 p.m.

SALT WATER

The heavy concentrations of Yellowtails are still centered around Rocky Point and fish counts, which are usually somewhat padded, are still very high. The closest landing to these fish is, of course, Redondo Pier. These boats are loading up on trips which take from 1/2 hour to 1 hour. The small boat fishermen are getting some fish but the fish are being stirred up by some of the boatmen who ignore the chum lines laid out by the large live bait boats. These yellowtails are all in the 6 pound class and can be a lot of fun on light mono. I advise 12 pound line as being a good choice. The small jigs are good and the best color seems to be yellow. Have a good selection of hooks in your tackle box from size 1 through 8. Remember the limit on small yellowtails (under 28 inches) is 5.

Other landings, too far from the Rocky area are trying their own waters and are coming up with some good fishing. Santa Monica to Malibu are reporting good catches of halibut (limit 2) and some barracuda and bonita. Malibu and Paradise Cove are starting to pick up some of those big bull bass which made them famous a few years back. Horseshoe Kelp and Catalina still slow but should break open at any time as the water is warming. Still no signs of those big yellowtail schools which were reported moving from Mexico to the Coronado Islands but they have had cold water there and should break loose at any time. Remember, the small boats must have the new numbers on them. We have them at Sportsville U.S.A. Don't get caught without them.

FRESH WATER

Irvine fishing picked up somewhat after a lull of about a week. Bass being taken on black jigs and bombers with trout on bait and slow trolling of spin lures. Best bait is worms, and red eggs with cheese working well for still fishermen.

Cachuma bass fishing still good. Mostly bottom bouncing but some fish taken on artificial worms trolled slow. Fish and Game stocked 1000 fingerling channel cats. They hope to make this lake one of the best producers of cats on the West Coast.

Crystal Lake trout fishing good. Red eggs and worms working best.

Railroad Canyon Lake. Good bass fishing. One of the few lakes taking bass on the surface. Crappie being taken on flies and small spinners. Wolford. Many limits of trout up to 3 pounds.

Isabella. This is my vote for the best of the week. The bass fishing is picking up fast and the weather has been good. Lots of Crappie being caught with many in the 2 to 2 1/2 pound class. Trout fishing poor. A good way to fish this lake is to slow troll around the trees which grow out of the water. Some of the best lures are Super Dupers and Abu Reflex lures. Bait also good for still fishing.
