Irritation in Lomita

EDITOR
THE PRESS:

A recent editorial in Lomita characterized the officials of the City of Torrance as "Ruthless, unimpaired, aggressive and often ridiculous." In the light of the actions of Torrance officials, this characterization would seem appropriate and we offer some evidence in the following.

Before a water hearing in the Woods Elementary School the Mayor of Torrance assured the gathering that Torrance doesn't want to intrude into the affairs of Lomita unless the majority of the people there want them to. But in actual practice does the City of Torrance recognize the people's right of self determination—a tenet upon which our democratic government is supposed to have its basis? It would seem not. The people voted four to one to bond themselves \$600,000 for water improvement and to join County Water Works District 13. The one-sided vote should be overwhelming proof of their desire. But not so to Torrance, who proceed to file condemnation proceedings against Narbonne Ranch Water No. 2, thus prohibiting the sale of bonds and preventing the people from getting water. (It should be remembered that a Public Utilities dam prevents any one in this area having water service until the service is improved. Nor does the sanitation and fire hazard trouble these men.)

It would be all right in official Torrance view to serve water in Lomita but not for the county to serve a small neglected area in Torrance.

The City of Torrance then attempts to annex a portion of Lomita at Grenshaw and Lomita Blvd. The property owners there oppose this six to two. These people well know the increase in taxes that would follow being included in Torrance. However, at the protest hearing the city refuses to recognize the protests of all the land owners—stating that because one owner had purchased his property in June of '59 (long before Torrance filed boundaries) that his petition could not be recognized, thus necessitating these same property owners the expense of a law suit to compel Torrance to act in a legal manner. The protests of assessed land value are well over the 50% required by law if this one piece of property had been included.

In modern day affairs can we afford the luxury of irresponsibility? Can progress be held up by officials without regard for the welfare of others?
