## Torrance Meets Lomita to Agree on Water Fight

Torrance officials, an attorney for Narbonne Ranch Water Co. No. 2, and the chief engineer of the county water works met this week and agreed to agree.

They agreed to hold another meeting in an effort to get improved water facilities into northern Lomita and southeastern Torrance.

A Torrance suit has been holding up annexation of the territory by the county water district and resultant sale of \$600,000 in bonds to finance improvement.

Torrance wants to buy the Narbonne water company, but the owner will not split it.

Angus McVicar and the city manager's office are preparing and engineering study as a basis for agreement.

At the meeting were City Attorney Stanley Remelmeier, McVicar, George Stevens, city manager, Randall Lunt, chief county engineer, and Gilmore Tillman, attorney for the water company.

## First Applications for Powder Puff Derby Will Be Accepted for Start Here on April 20

April 20 will mark the first applications for entry in the annual All-Woman Transcontinental Air Race, more popularly known as the "Powder Puff Derby," will be accepted. Entries will remain open until midnight June 20.

Take-off positions for the race, to be held July 9 to 13, will be determined in the order they are received at race headquarters, 11 E. Spring St., Long Beach. It is expected that between 30 and 40 women will enter on the day, so a drawing will be held to determine their official position and official race number.

This 2509, 13 mile race course crosses the United States from

coast to coast will touch 9 states from the starting point in Torrance on a route via Needles, Prescott and Winslow, Albuquerque, Amarillo, Oklahoma City, Ft. Smith, Memphis, Chattanooga, Johnson City, Roanoke, to the terminus in Wilmington, Delaware.

Official time stamps will be located at each of these designated airports where the pilots may refuel or remain overnight.

No night or instrument flying is permitted, and the contestants must be on the ground at one of these listed airports by sunset each night. Take-off the following morning is not permitted until official sunrise.

The race is for stock-model airplanes, single or multi-engine, of between 85 and 350 horsepower and manufactured after Jan. 1, 1950. All entrants must hold an airman's certificate of private grade or higher and must have a minimum of 100 hours solo time with 50 hours cross-country experience. Passengers or co-pilots need not be rated.

The first plane to cross the finish line is not necessarily the winner. A par-speed handicap in knots is established for each make and model of airplane eligible. The winner is that airplane which averages the highest ground speed in relation to its par speed.

Torrance and the Long Beach chapter of the Ninety-Nines, Inc. (international organization of woman pilots) will host the start of the race and the Wilmington

Civic Businessmen's Association and the Eastern Pennsylvania Chapter of the Ninety-Nines, Inc. will be hosts for the terminus.

The Powder Puff Derby is sanctioned by the National Aeronautic Association, conducted under the rules and regulations of the Federation Aeronautique Internationale and sponsored by the Ninety-Nines, Inc. It is planned and managed by a nine-woman board of directors with headquarters in Long Beach.

Deadline to impound all racing airplanes at Torrance will be 5 p.m. July 6. Take-off will be 9 a.m. July 9, and planes must cross the finish line at New Castle County Airport, Wilmington, Delaware by noon of July 13 to qualify.
