prominent offenders, parking all day in front of their stores. Abe Robinson, chairman of the Downtown Merchants Association, said more than 95% of the people want the meters out. "It's not just the merchants," he declared.

A policeman on a three-wheel motorcycle will enforce the two-hour limit. The meterettes will be absorbed by the police department and given something else to do.

Over-all cost to the general fund for the elimination of meters, including cost of the parking lots, will be about \$23,000.

School Board Studies Union Wage Requests

The Torrance Board of Education has under consideration a list of requests by the school union representing classified employees.

The board indicated all will not be granted and asked the union for its order of preference. It was indicated the district already will be faced with likelihood of a \$1 tax-override election in the fall.

The district employees' recommendations include: All accumulated leave at retirement be paid to the employee as a bonus.

Reduction of the five-step promotional plan to three steps.

A group health and welfare plan containing hospital payment and sickness, surgical, medical, and life insurance at no cost to the employees. It is requested

that representatives of employee organizations participate in selection and administration of such a plan.

All employees be provided time-and-a-half pay for all work in excess of eight hours a day and 40 hours a week. Time-and-a-half for all Saturday and Sunday work.

Employees whose shift begins at 4 p.m. or later receive 10 cents

an hour more for work performed before midnight and 12½ cents an hour for work performed from midnight to 8 a.m.

When an employee is called to work prior to or after his regularly scheduled work shift, the employee shall be given a minimum amount of four hour's pay. If the work exceeds four hours, the employee shall then be paid for eight.
