Palica's Hit In Ninth Gives Tartars Win

Erv Palica's infield single with two aboard in the ninth inning gave the Torrance Tartars a 4-3 victory over league-leading El Segundo Tuesday and saved a tremendous pitching performance by Tom Richardson.

Young Erv's clutch hit with Bill Williams and Jim Armstrong on base, each previously singling off the deliveries of Bob "No-Hit" Flynn, put a climax to one of the most thrilling baseball games ever witnessed by this reporter and 250 fans who jammed into the Torrance Park bleachers.

Lefty Tom Richardson was pitching a no-hitter until the sixth when Mike Sanchez singled, Flynn walked and Eagle first baseman Gary Grossart hit the second pitch over the right field fence into the street to give El Segundo three runs and tie the score.

The Tartars scored in the first inning. McGuire and Armstrong got a safety and Palica drove them both in with a blast of his own. The two hits Palica collected in this game boosted his batting average to a fat .611 with 12 runs batted in.

The loss was Flynn's second of the year and the win gave Richardson a 4-1 record in league play and pushed the Tartars to only one game of first place. Four games remain in the season.

As almost everybody knows this Saturday marks the pening of the High Sierras for trout fishing. The bulk of the fishermen will fish Lake Crowley and many of them will be fishing this fabulous lake for the first time. Heres some hints on how to fish the high lakes. The best way to fish Crowley or Bridgeport Lakes is trolling. Some people troll spinners or spinners and worm combinations but most of the trolling is done with a attractor which is a double blade setup. There are several on the market with the Dave Davis and the Ford Fender being the most popular. These are attached to the end of the line with a good ball bearing swivel which eliminates line twist. Behind the spinner you attach a leader about 18 to 24 inches long. On this leader you attach your lure. Some of the best lures are Flatfish, Supper, Duper, Hot Shots, and other wobbling spoons. Bait fishermen use worms, and red salmon eggs. Get your worms at the local sporting goods stores as the worms in the high country are very small. Good luck.

On the salt water front the heavy winds didn't seem to bother the fish and many limits of baracuda were taken off Rocky Point. The fish were in the surf and we had many reports of people fishing the surf and catching logs. The yellows are scarce but should move back as the weather clears. San Diego has started to pick up with the fish reports in the hundreds. These fish have been there for some time but refuse to bite. Jigs and bait have been working equally well. Paradise Cove and Malibu have good fishing for big baracuda and bull bass as well as halibut fishing which remains the old timers of the days of old.

We hope to have a up to the minute report of fishing at Ocean-side after our trip on Sunday. If you hear a noise like a airaid siren you'll know that We've broken that big jackpot at Ocean-side. For more information call or stop in at Sportsville U.S.A. FA 8-2173.

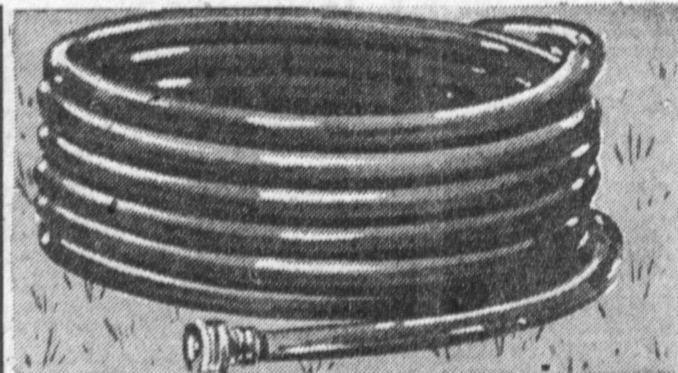

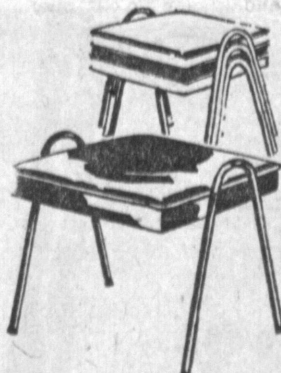
