### **Denial of All Counts Due Tomorrow**

Attorney to Attack Constitutionality of City, State Statutes

Fireman Dick DeArmitt, through his attorney, Joseph Taback of Beverly Hills, tomorrow will file an answer to charges that he took part in the recent cityelection campaign in viola-

tion of law. The answer, to be sent to the Civil Service Commission, will

deny all charges. It further will attack the accusations as violations of the

United States Constitution. Taback said the laws are vague and indefinite as to what is meant by "active participation," they deny free speech, and enforcement of the measures are unconstitutional since hundreds of city employees put election stickers on their cars.

Alluding to a campaign letter written by DeArmitt's wife Loradelle, Taback said that if a law can tell a city employee's family what to do, this is a clear violation of the First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution,
