Jet Trip to Paris First Prize in Singer Contest

To be eligible contestants must take eight sewing lessons, and make a dress at a Singer Center. Each shop will select a winner in the three categories.

New York has been chosen for the next round of judging. At this level, the estimated 50,000 entries have been narrowed to 108—three from each of the 36 headquarters. Of this group, 15 will be selected to come to New York for final judging.

These 15 girls will be invited to come to New York, with their mothers or a family-approved companion, for an all-expense stay at one of New York's top hotels.

After a whirlwind of theaters, sightseeing, and parties, they will participate in a fashion show before an audience of fashion and sewing experts.

The grand-prize winner in each age group will be announced at this showing. All winners receive generous cash awards; the three top winners receive exciting trips, in addition to cash.

Aug. 27 marks the deadline for completing the dresses. Entry blanks and complete rules may be obtained at Singer Sewing centers.

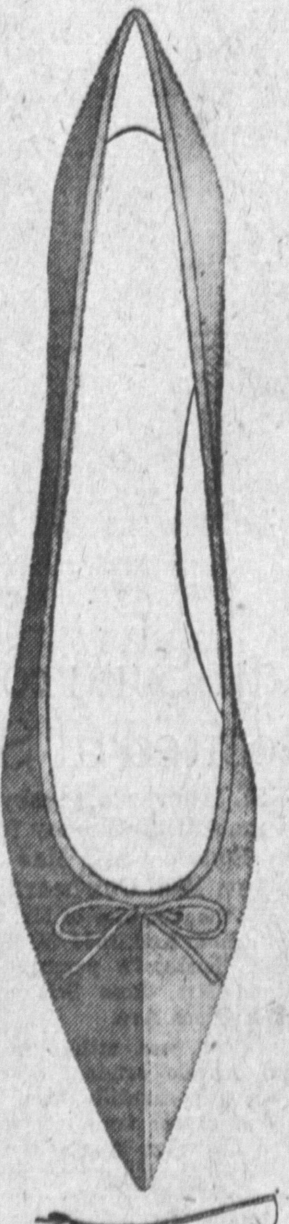
