We had a great trip to Oceanside although we didn't break the big jackpot. We fished on the limited capacity boat Palomar, which will fish 49 people with ease. We left the landing at 5 o'clock and picked up bait right from the live bait boat. They have some bait problem now but it is a temporary problem. We headed up to La Jolla Kelp and fished for barracuda and yellows with some white sea bass to boot. I wanted yellows so I hooked on a size 6 hook directly to my monofil line and cast out a lively bait. I hooked up 14 straight times and lost 14 straight barracuda but I didn't care because I wanted a yellowtail. On my 15th cast I hooked and landed a yellow about 10 pounds. Then I tied on a shorty wire leader and started in on the barracuda. After about 5 nice logs I started experimenting with different new jigs and lures. The green and yellow feather worked best and the only jog that caught any amount of fish was the Fluorescent Hi Lite, which I wrote up in Outdoors With Mel a few weeks ago. If you plan to go fishing soon take a few tips from me. If you want barracuda make sure you have shorty wire leaders. If you fish with feathers or jigs for barracuda use a jig leader. I lost 6 feathers in a hurry and couldn't buy any on the boat and was almost out of business. Have a good variety of hooks in all sizes. I caught my yellow on a size 8 hook and went to this size because the yellows were really spooky.

The report above is typical of the reports from all the landings. Lots of barracuda with some bass, halibut and bonito, but not too many yellows being hooked. The San Diego boats were fishing at La Jolla kelp, so there's not too much going on at the Coronados yet.

On the fresh water scene the action was centered at the high lakes with most of the fishermen happy but not too many large fish reported. Many of the fishermen who tried Crowley opening day decided to fish stream the second day and were rewarded by good size fish. The biggest report was an 8-pound rainbow out of the Walker River.

Closer to home fishing remained good on Cachuma and Isabella with lots of nice bass limits taken and crowds small due to the opening of the High Sierra.

Irvine fishing has been gradually picking up with trout and bass leading the parade. San Gabriel River is being stocked regularly and is providing good fishing close to home. Hemet has been good on trout and the best fishing is being done with small spinners and Super Dupers while trolling slow.

## Munich Meets Los Angeles All-Stars Here in International Soccer Tilt

International soccer football breaks into Southern California's ever-busy sports program tomorrow night, when the powerful Munich 1860 club of West Germany meets the Los Angeles All-Stars at Wrigley Field.

The game marks the second appearance of a German team at Wrigley Field. Borussia Dortmund licked the Plymouth Argyle of England, 8-1, there in 1954 before 10,250.

The Munich club, celebrating its 100th anniversary by traveling to America, is loaded with national soccer heroes including such fairly-footed forwards as Rudolf Koelbl, Ekkehard Feigen-span and Hans Auernhammer, Capt. George Koelbl, aggressive fullback, and goalie Gerhard Bechtold, one of the continent's outstanding net custodians.

Los Angeles will not be without its stars. Noted forwards include Roberto Federico from Argentina, Billy Steel from Scotland, Freddy Cameron from Canada and Al Zerhusen, rated the No. 1 native born player in the country.

Steel, who appeared in 28 international games for Scotland, brought \$60,000 when sold by Derby County to Dundee United

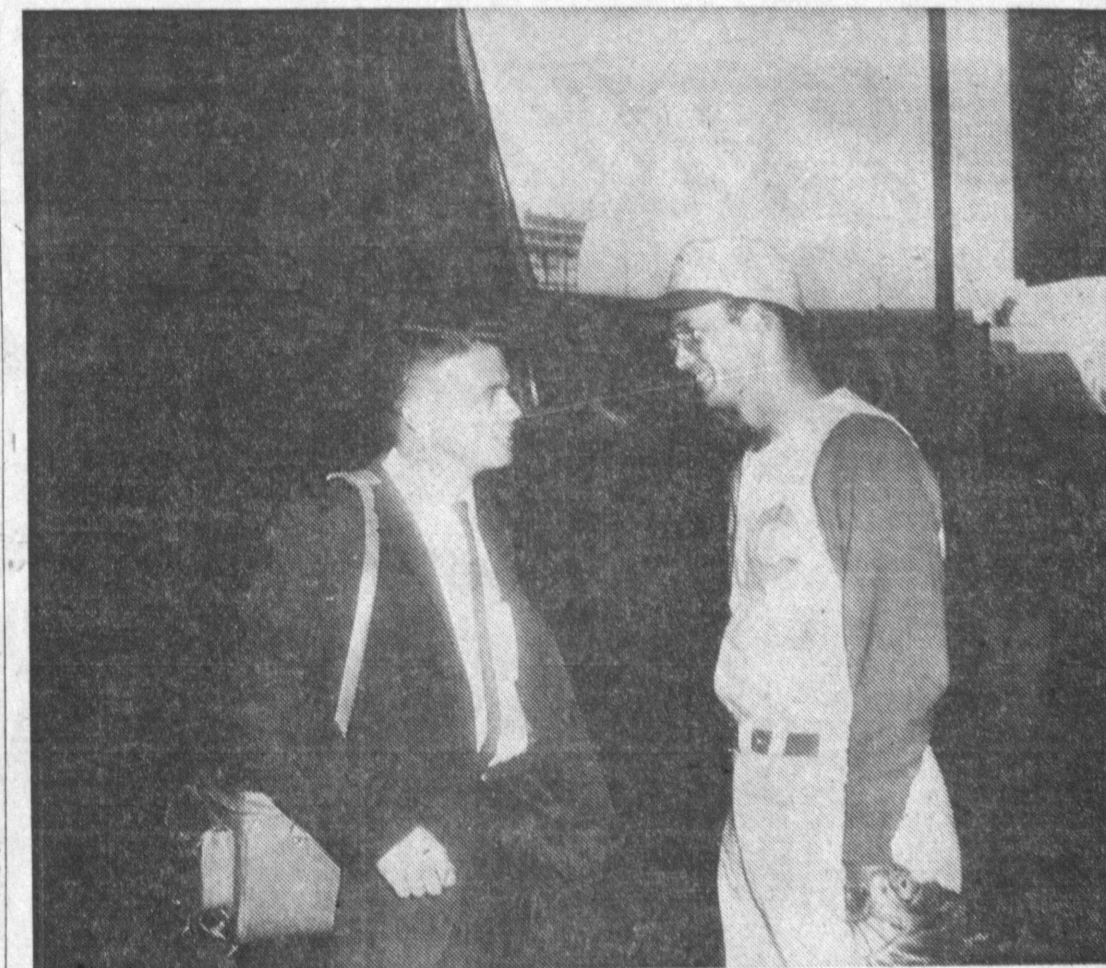
shortly before coming to Los Angeles.

The Los Angeles team has been working together for several months and promises to field a unified combination against Munich, that this year defeated glamorous Manchester United of England, 3-2, in an exhibition game.

Manchester United, that has spent more than \$1,500,000 in rebuilding since the Munich air disaster of 1958, will be at Wrigley Field June 1 to meet Hearts of Edinburgh, Scottish champions, in soccer's Dream Game.
