In making the award, North American praised Aeronca for its success in this new field of-manufacturing stainless steel honey comb structures.

This recently developed tech-Que provides a high strength nsulating material for the B-7which will fly continously, over long distances, at speeds three times faster than sound. Conventional aircraft materials, such as aluminum, lose their strength at the high temperatures which will be developed.

According to Rutledge, the production units required for the B-70's development are the largt brazed stainless steel honeycomb structures built. The manufacture involves major programs in tooling, process development, welding and quality con-

trol along with the brazing. Rutledge said that one of the structures is a panel more than 30 feet long and 15 feet widenearly the size of a passenger transit bus.

"We are extremely pleased to the back in the very vital B-70 program," Rutledge said. "We hope that the decision to build a prototype is only the begin-ning and that the complete B-70 program will be reinstated soon.'
