The following morning he graciously came to Torrance to participate in the Baseball Day Parade honoring the city's 3000 Little, Babe Ruth, and Pony Leaguers. And this with only a few hours rest. He had committed himself to George Vico and this reporter earlier in the week. He could have called it off and most every true baseball fan would have understood. He got here, however, and thousands of youngsters and grown-ups went home and told friends that they had seen the fabulous Koufax and in some instances waving an autographed baseball.

The Dodger parade car moved into view and Sandy promised to continue the interview at some later date at the Coliseum.

I've got that feeling that Sandy will fan 20 in one game before the season is over and establish himself as the record holder. He's young, durable and clean-cut. Like rolling a natural everytime.

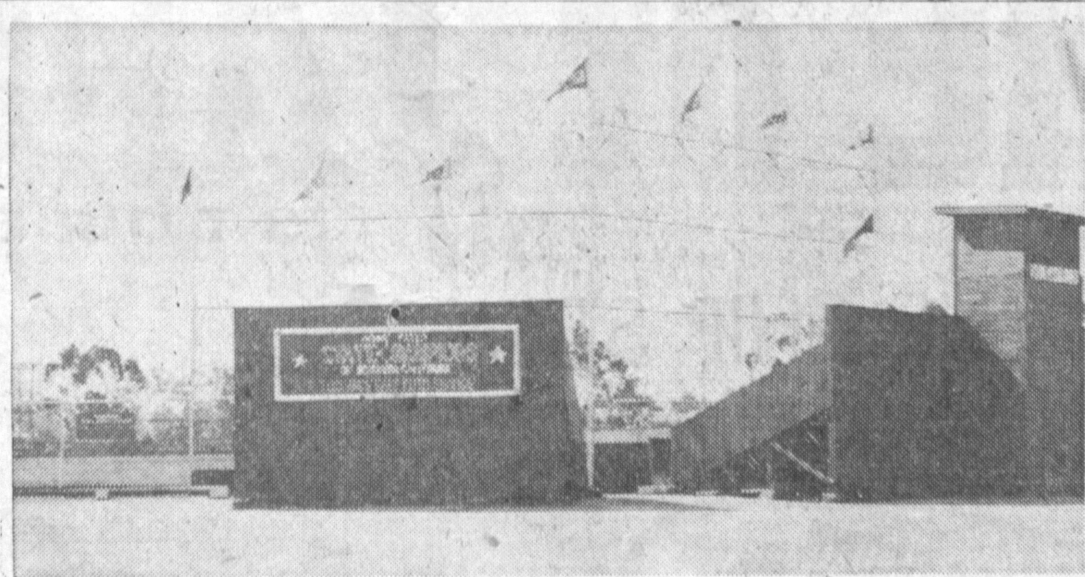
