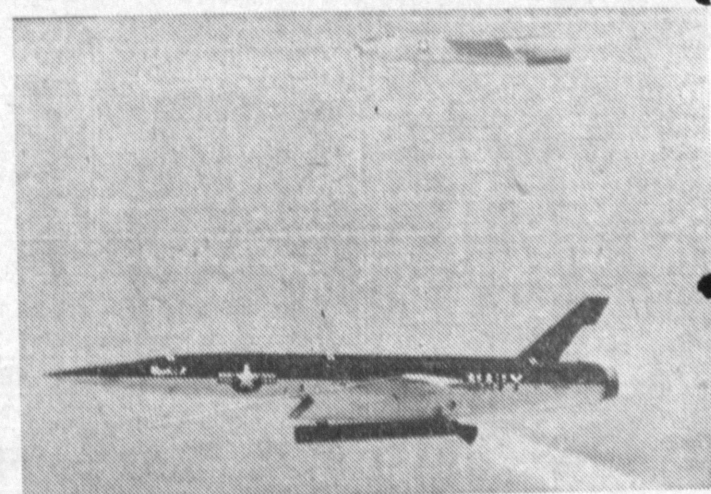

High School to Give Annual Spring Concert This Friday

Vocal and instrumental organizations of Torrance High School will fill the air with music at their annual Spring Concert Friday at 8 p.m. in the auditorium. Selections from the Broadway musicals "South Pacific," "My Fair Lady," and "The King and I" will be part of the evening's entertainment. The Girl's Glee Club will open the program with "Greeting," by Mendelssohn, "Whistle a Happy Tune," from "The King and I," and other songs. The group is under direction of Vincent Di Fiore. Francis Snyder will direct the Tartar Dance Band and the Tartar Band in such numbers as "The Knightsbridge March," "The South Pacific," "Around the World in 80 Days," and "Begin the Beguine." The Tartar Concert Choir, under direction of Roger D. Axworthy, will present selections by Vaughan-Williams, Brahms, and Loewe. Included will be "The Blessed Son of God" by Williams, "The Yellow Rose of Texas," "Erie Canal," and folk songs by Brahms. Concluding the program will be selections from "My Fair Lady." The concert will be public. There is no admission charge.

Pacific Telephone to Slash Bulk in This Year's Books

For reasons of bulk and economy, Pacific Telephone has started a program to reduce all telephone prefix names to the first two letters in all directories. Harold Dryden, directory manager for Pacific, said the move will reduce the size of directories and will save thousands of dollars in printing. Pacific, he said, publishes 6,000,000 directories a year for its Southern California customers with the printing bill running into millions. The contraction program has already begun in some outlying directories and will show up in the downtown Los Angeles central directory when that book is delivered in June. A number like MADISON 1-1607 may appear in the new downtown book as MA 1-1607. The plan is a result of population gains in this area, and Dryden pointed out that the new central directory will weigh 36 pounds, with 1520 pages. Dryden also pointed out that mounting population, along with direct-distance dialing, which 80% of Los Angeles area customers now have, will bring about a second innovation soon. He said the Bell System has tested a plan to substitute all numerals for the present prefix-numeral system and asserted that the first installation of the new plan in this area will be made in Newhall in June. "The country and telephone service are growing so fast," Dryden said "that the present prefix system is rapidly being outmoded. There are not enough prefixes to go round."
