Youth Bands to Present 14th Annual Concert at El Camino

The Torrance Area Youth Bands will present their 14th anniversary concert Saturday in the Campus Theater, El Camino College.

The band, composed of 60 high-school students, will perform on the first half of the concert, and the Junior Band, made up of 70 elementary-school musicians, will play the second half.

Featured soloists will be winners of the Student Music Scholarship Competitions. These competitions, sponsored by the Youth Band and the Torrance Junior Woman's Club, are held annually in conjunction with the Artist Series.

Winners for this year include Margaret Shidler, senior piano division; Mary Titus, senior wind-instrument

division; Dale Stitt, junior wind-instrument division; Kathleen Jessome, junior piano division; and Merryl Drabin, voice and string instruments.

The senior division and voice-and-string division winners will each receive a \$100 music scholarship from the Torrance Junior Woman's Club.

The junior-division winners will each receive a \$50 music scholarship. These competition winners, besides playing for the Youth Band's Anniversary concert, will perform for the Torrance Juniors during their annual spring fashion show at the club house May 25.

Numbers to be performed include "Grandfather's Drum," featuring Ted Bluechel, drummer; "Elsa's Procession to be Cathedral," "The Pearl Fishers" overture, Amparito Roca; "Ballet Parisien," "The Blue Tail Fly," "High Society," highlights from "South Pacific," and "Bugler's Holiday," featuring trumpeters Johnny Alter, John Friedemann, and Danny George.

During the second half the Junior Band will play "Birthday Bouquet," "Humoresque," "Forest Prince," and

the "Victory March." James Davidson and Neil Short will be guest conductors.

The concert will begin at 8 p.m. Admission is by season ticket or \$1 for adults and 50c for students. Members of the Junior Woman's Club will be ushers.

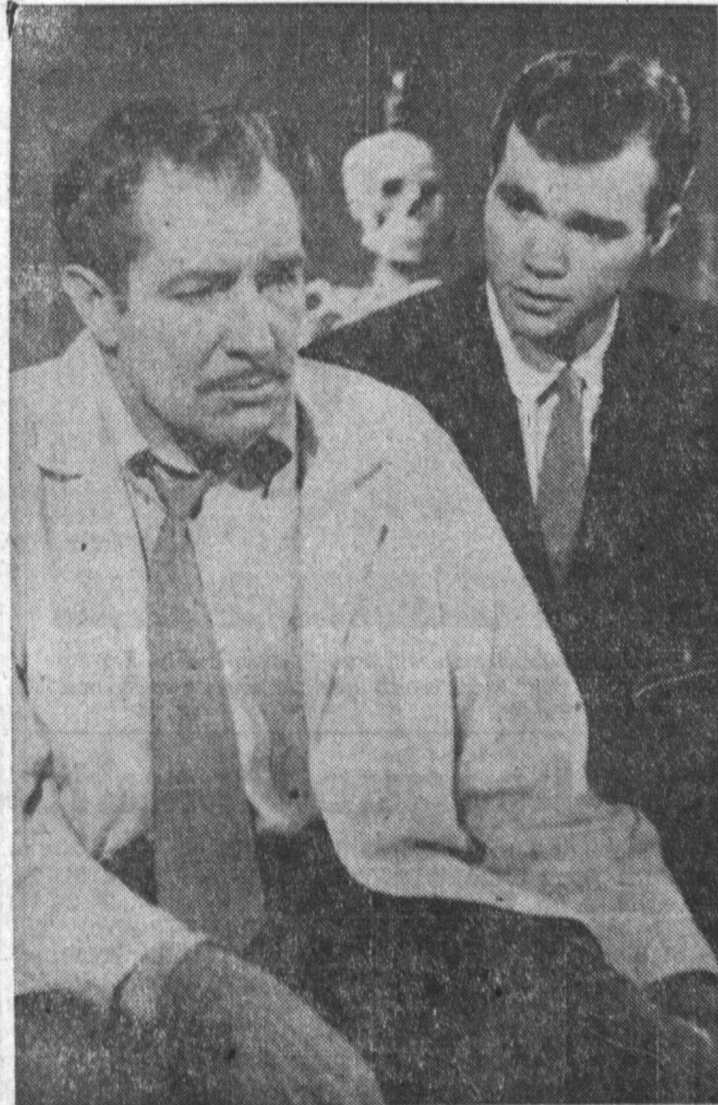
Di Tullio Trio Will Appear at Harbor College

Mobile Emergency Canteen to Be Displayed on Saturday

One of the features of the Armed Forces Day parade in Torrance Saturday, will be the Red Cross mobile disaster canteen.

Taking its place among a wide variety of national-defense equipment used in military service, the disaster unit will represent awareness of the importance of Civil Defense.

The canteen, a gift of the AFL-CIO, is a part of the Red Cross blueprint for preparedness. It is designed to be driven by a volunteer member of the motor service and manned by volunteer canteen workers.

"The canteen is used frequently by Red Cross when

there is need for emergency feeding," explained Mrs. Robert Orsini, volunteer disaster chairman for Torrance.

Stocked at all times to serve 500 persons, the big white truck is available to all areas covered by the Los Angeles chapter.

Included in the equipment are a stove, refrigerator, stretcher, cooking utensils, and 70 gallons of drinking water.
